## **TIKI EXHIBITION** KURA GALLERY 95A CUSTOMS STREET

An exhibition of new and recent works by Robyn Kahukiwa, continuing her long-standing interest in uplifting and empowering Māori people, and promoting mana motuhake and tino rangatiratanga.



THE KIWI ART TRAIL TE KOMITITANGA TO SILO PARK

Kiwi sculptures will brighten up the waterfront of downtown Tāmaki Makaurau teaching Aucklanders and visitors about the plight of our national taonga species, the Kiwi.



A LONG WHITE CLOUD THE LIGHTSHIP, QUAY STREET

A contemporary installation on a massive 110-metre-long, 13-metre -high digital light wall on Bledisloe Wharf by artist Jae Hoon Lee.



Two major and symbolic wall murals depicting Te Toangaroa and Tāmaki Herenga Waka, and a kawau pū (shag) standing tall.



A photographic exhibition on large panels in the Atrium on Takutai and around The Pavilions in Te Ara Tahuhu, celebrating the beauty of the country and also delving into the issues it faces.



Digital screens on display in the foyer of the iconic Dilworth Building featuring large-scale watercolour art.

Don't miss this incredible art installation on the Freyberg Square steps by artist Eduardo Tolentino Tan, capturing this year's theme of vitality through the colours and elements of spring.




