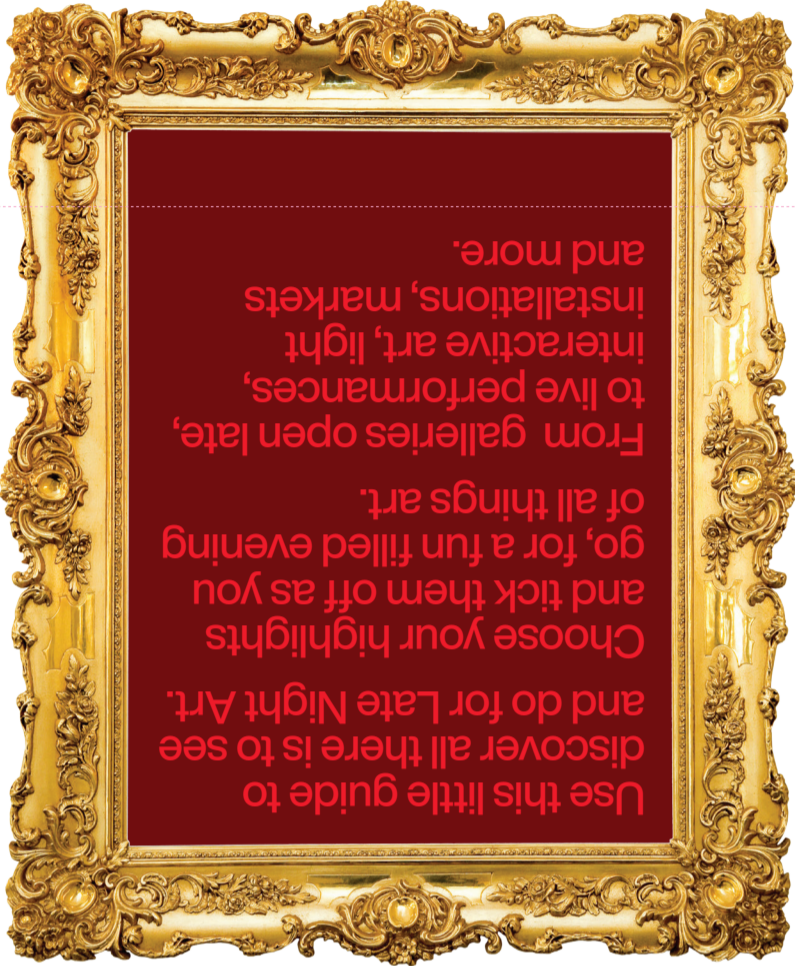

Art Week is delivered by Heart of the City and proudly supported by Auckland Council and the city centre targeted rate.

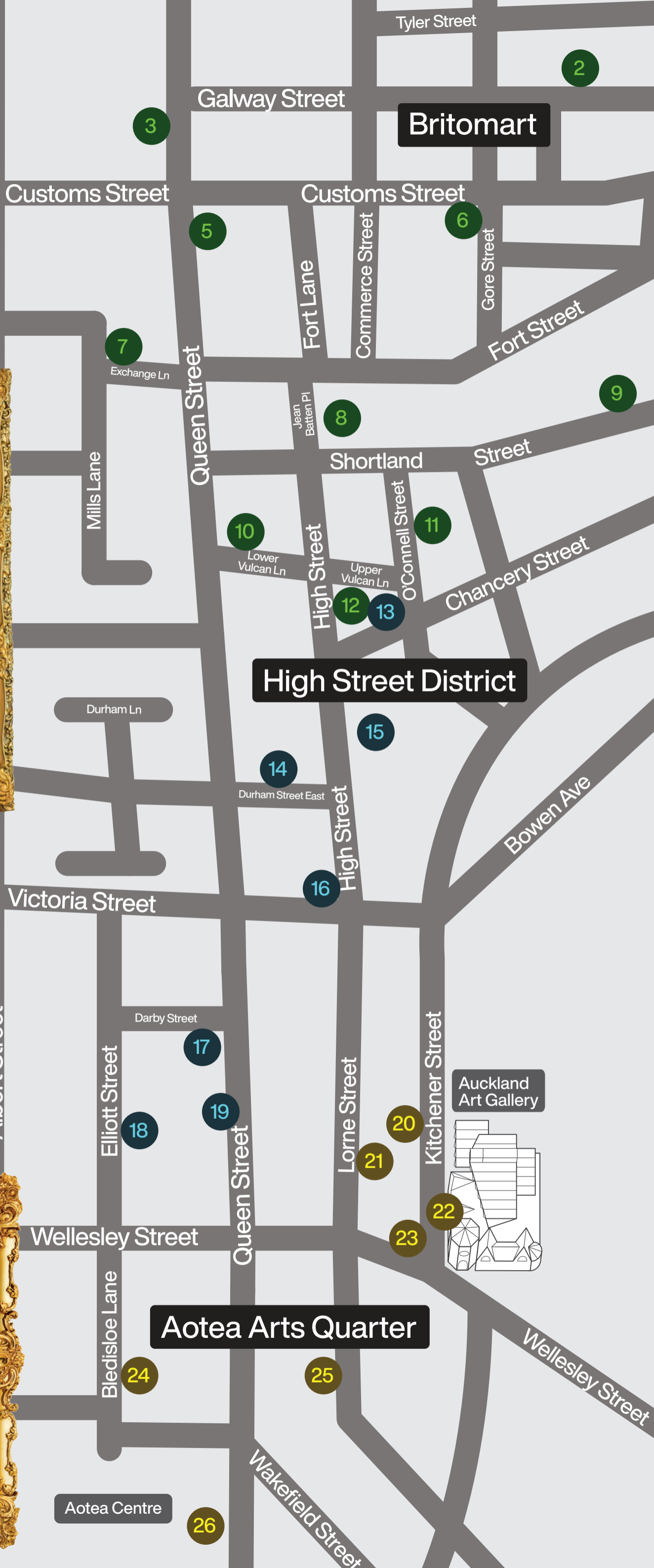
